After 10 years of serving at Carriage Town Ministries, I'm hard-pressed to think of a challenge at least one guest hasn't experienced before coming here.

Chronic pain. Financial problems. Relationship struggles. Death in the family. Near-death experience. Homelessness. Joblessness. Loneliness. They've all been carried through our doors.

Nobody is immune from hardship. Yet, difficulty often causes us to lose hope. We just can't see beyond — or through — the circumstance. But here's some Good News.

# The Savior of the world understands our pain.

Jesus was tempted in the desert. He knew poverty as He ministered. He felt heartbroken when Lazarus died. He was weary from his journeys. He was betrayed by His best friends. Jesus was cursed, struck, spat on and tortured ... all because He loves us.

# Stage 3 cancer took him out of work,

# but led Chuck to greater faith

# "God has been really generous to me," Chuck says.

It's not what you would think someone might say after enduring eviction, joblessness, homelessness and a stage 3 cancer diagnosis. But that's the attitude your compassion has helped Chuck to develop.

Last year, Chuck was kicked out of his apartment when he found out his roommate wasn't paying his share of the rent. Chuck had already left his job as an overnight manager of a local grocery store after a stage 3 melanoma diagnosis forced him to stop working. So here he was, a Boston native searching for a place to survive in Flint, Michigan.

"I actually stopped a police officer and asked him for a shelter recommendation. He immediately said, 'Carriage Town Ministries.'" And Chuck is so thankful he did.

"Sure, going through treatment and losing my job and living situation has been a challenge," Chuck says, "But I've looked at every day as a blessing. It's been a gift to have a roof over my head, a bed to sleep in, food, and opportunities to work towards my goals."

Thanks to your support, Chuck has also received the guidance of our Health Clinic volunteers and medical professionals as he endures chemotherapy.

"Coming here and having a chance to create a Personal Success Plan has helped me reset my goals and make my priorities a little straighter," Chuck shares.

With the help of his plan, Chuck has already secured housing with a good friend he met at Carriage Town Ministries. His hope is to go into remission, and then he'd like to go back to work.

Despite his very difficult challenges, Chuck is grateful that he has grown closer to Christ.

"Every night when I go to bed, I spend at least 20 minutes by the side of my bed praying," Chuck shares. "And in the morning, I spend more time thanking Jesus for allowing me to have another day."

It's a perspective that can inspire us all.

# Are you turning 70 1/2 this year?

You will not be taxed on the transfer, and it counts as your required distribution. Best of all, it is easy. Contact your IRA custodian to see how you can maximize tax savings. The IRA charitable distribution allows you to transfer any amount up to \$100,000 from your IRA directly to nonprofits. You pay no taxes on the transfer, and your gift supports our important work.
