Having safe shelter, warm meals, and her own room gave Eleanor time to rest. With the welcoming environment here, she also felt "safe and protected."

Thanks to your generosity, Eleanor finally had an opportunity to think about her own future, make a plan to secure safe housing, and continue to do God's work.

She also helped out graciously during her stay with a positive, hard-working spirit!

"I wanted to help with whatever they

asked me to do, because I wanted to give back what they gave me," Eleanor shares.

This March, after a three-month stay, Eleanor found a safe living environment. Your generosity helped her bridge the gap between homelessness and stability.

2021 Update Regarding Gifts from Your IRA

For individuals 70-1/2 years or older, you can give any amount up to \$100,000 per year from your IRA directly to qualifying charities, including Carriage Town Ministries without having to pay income taxes on the money.

This popular gift option is known as a qualified charitable distribution and is commonly called the IRA charitable rollover. After being waived for 2020 by the CARES Act, required minimum distributions (RMD) from retirement accounts resumed in 2021. If you are 72 or older, your qualified charitable distribution can satisfy all or part of your RMD.

Always consult with your financial advisor for questions regarding gifts from your IRA.
