

It's truly given us a platform to develop transitional workers into MVP employees beyond our doors.

Over the years, we've seen residents learn the important skills of showing up on time, asking if there's any more work to do, and proving trustworthy with small and large tasks. We've seen employees learn how to budget money and save for rent. We've also seen the confidence of Blueline employees soar as they discover a passion and turn it into a profitable job.

In addition, Blueline served as a bridge between the homeless population in our community and our police and first responders. It's a safe space where a good donut and cup of coffee bring people together.

God has continued to bless the endeavor – from providing a resident who used to own a donut shop to moving the hearts of individuals to fund most of the labor and construction of our new retail storefront, Carriage Town Bakery.

Our hope today is to keep growing by adding products, expanding our customer base and lengthening our store hours. While we hope to make enough revenue to cover the cost of employee salaries, ingredients needed for baked goods and even utilities on the building, Carriage Town Bakery will always be a ministry.

From brokenness to whole in Christ

On the surface, a broken thumb brought Sean to Carriage Town Ministries.

While working in a factory, he aggravated his hand trying to keep up with the assembly line. After surgery, he couldn't keep up at all and lost his job.

But if you look a little deeper, Sean came to Carriage Town Ministries because of a broken childhood. As a little boy, Sean grew up in a home marred by addiction. He vividly remembers the day he had to send his sister to their aunt's house and his brother to their grandparents, because home was no longer a safe place to be.

"I basically raised myself," Sean shares.

"We all split up, which was a big tragedy in my life, because I felt unloved, uncared for, and I would just feel empty."

Sean did the best he could throughout the years, but his lack of a support system was evident when his injury at work left him without a paycheck and, eventually, without a home.

Thanks to compassionate supporters like you, Carriage Town Ministries has served as a refuge for Sean.

He was skeptical of what we could offer, but after his first two weeks surrounded by kindness, rest and spiritual support, Sean knew this is where God needed him to be.

"I found God coming to Carriage Town Ministries," Sean expresses. "With them helping me, my life has turned around dramatically. I think more clearly. I make decisions and think about the consequences, which leads me to make right choices."

Sean works in our kitchen, a role he loves. In addition to filling and frosting the donuts, he's learning to mix and fry them. Baking reminds Sean of happier times from his childhood with his grandmother. "She taught me how to cook," he recalls.

Sean's long-term goal is to work in a hospital serving others. The good news is that no matter where God leads him next, he knows he isn't alone. Despite his broken past, Sean is whole in Christ.
